## Sailfish Smart

PBA's textbook rental program, <u>Sailfish Smart</u>, offers a convenient and cost-effective way for your student to receive all required course materials for each semester, including textbooks, lab manuals, and access codes, on or before the first day of class.



#### **How Sailfish Smart Works:**

- Once your student has registered for classes, your student will be automatically enrolled in the program at \$24 per credit hour. This charge will be placed on your student's account.
- Thirty days before classes begin, your student will receive an email to verify the order.
- When the materials are ready for pickup, the PBA Bookstore will send an email. Your student should bring the order number to the Bookstore. Alternatively, the materials can be delivered to your student's home address.
- Return materials at the end of the semester, or keep them for an additional fee by contacting the Bookstore.

#### **Important Things to Remember:**

- Your student is automatically enrolled in the Sailfish Smart program at the beginning of each semester.
- Your student must confirm the order so that the PBA Bookstore can prepare the course materials.
- While this program offers great convenience at an affordable rate, there may be a semester where it
  makes sense for your student to opt out based on your student's circumstances. The link to opt out
  is available in our <u>Sailfish Smart FAQ</u> under the question "If I choose not to participate, how do I opt
  out?" Please note that the link will only be active during the opt-out period and can only be
  accessed by an active PBA student.

## Financial Aid & Semester Charges

### **Applying for Financial Aid**

- 1. If eligible, the first step in navigating financial aid is to file the FAFSA at studentaid.gov. Be sure to include PBA's FAFSA code: 008849.
- 2. Once PBA receives your FAFSA (or if your student is not eligible to file the FAFSA), the Financial Aid team will prepare a financial aid offer outlining all of the financial aid your student qualifies for. You will receive an update once your financial aid offer is ready. Then, you can schedule a call with your Admissions Counselor to discuss your financial aid offer and additional resources your student may qualify for.
- 3. To make sure that all of the financial aid you qualify for is included in your semester charges, we ask that your student submits the appropriate financial documents found on your student's Enrollment Checklist.
- 4. Be sure to file the FAFSA annually. It becomes available each year on October 1.

### **Universal Scholarship Application**

The Universal Scholarship Application allows students to apply for various PBA scholarship opportunities they may qualify for. This single application lets them apply to multiple funds at PBA. We encourage all students to complete the Universal Scholarship Application every year. Through the generosity of friends of PBA, additional scholarship opportunities become available annually.

## **Payment Arrangement Options**

1. Pay online in full or set up a Nelnet payment plan: A credit is placed on your account for the payment plan amount and monthly payments are made. See payment plan options in table below.

- 2. **Utilize loans** to cover your fall semester charges, such as Federal student loans, Parent PLUS loans or private loans
- 3. **Use your 529 plan or Florida Prepaid plans.** The estimated amount from your plan is credited in your account until the payment is received. After the payment is received the estimate is removed. This is commonly combined with financial aid. Please contact your 529 plan custodian for your plan requirements. You can also contact Student Accounts at 561-803-2152 for additional assistance.

- 6. **Have PBA directly bill your employer.** This includes both civilian and military. An estimated amount is credited on your account for the amount your employer will pay. The estimate is removed after payment is received.
- 7. Send Payment by mail to:

- 8. **By using your veterans' benefits.** An estimated amount is credited on your account for the amount authorized for your veterans' benefits. The estimate is removed when payment from the VA is received.
  - a. CH 33 and CH31 (Vocational Rehabilitation students) receive the estimate.
- b. CH 35 pays you directly, so you will not receive an estimate for your VA benefits. You will need to pay in full, use financial aid, establish a Nelnet payment plans, use a 529 plan, or have your employer billed.
- 9. Pay in person at the cashier's office located in the Student Accounts Office, Sachs Building.



# **Enrollment Checklist**

The Enrollment Checklist is a visual guide of all the required steps to fully prepare your student for the beginning of the semester. To access the Enrollment Checklist, your student will use the MyPBA login credentials provided. You can also find the Enrollment Checklist on my.pba.edu. It is important for your student to have the Enrollment Checklist completed by the deadline to gain PBA Card and residence hall (if applicable) access. See your student's Enrollment Checklist deadline below:

Students are required to complete the Enrollment Checklist prior to the start of each semester.



# **PBA Card & Parking**

### How to order my student's PBA Card?

Your student will use the PBA Card to access your student's residence hall (if applicable), the dining hall, and on campus buildings. In order for your student to have his or her PBA Card ready to pick up, please encourage your student to complete this <a href="form">form</a> to submit a PBA Card photo. Please make sure your student follows the instructions carefully to ensure the submitted photo will be accepted and complete this PBA Card ID form no later than August 6.

### Can my student have a car on campus?

For the first year, students who will be living on campus who were admitted to PBA as Freshmen are not eligible to park a car on campus. Although PBA's campus and the downtown West Palm Beach area are very walkable, we recognize that some students may desire to bring a car to PBA. The One Parking group offers off-campus parking at a discounted rate in parking garages at The Square, which are a 13-minute walk from campus. The current discounted rate is \$95/month. New students living on campus who were admitted to PBA as Transfer students may purchase an on-campus parking permit. Freshman and Transfer commuter students may purchase a commuter parking permit. Students are required to register a on campus vehicle with PBA's Department of Public Safety. Eligible students can purchase a on-campus parking permit once the Enrollment Checklist is complete.

Permit rates per semester:

On Campus Resident - \$400

Commuter - \$250

# **Hurricane Preparedness**

Our environment is considered tropical and offers unique features like warm weather year-round (if you consider 70 degree temps on some winter days warm!) and beautiful blue skies. It can be humid. To prevent any kind of bio growth in residence halls, students should keep their rooms clean, with surfaces wiped down and taking care not to leave the air conditioning on if your door is open. We experience brief rain showers frequently at certain times of year in the afternoon and, occasionally, tropical storms and even hurricanes. In the event of stormy weather, we prioritize the safety of our students, faculty, and staff by ensuring everyone is well-informed and prepared.

### **Preparation is Key**

PBA's community, including the Dept. of Public Safety and Emergency Management Team, maintains strong connections with local experts and government officials and the National Weather Service. These relationships help ensure our campus receives timely alerts and remains well-prepared for emergencies. If a storm approaches, Palm Beach Atlantic's president may decide to close the campus for safety reasons. During such closures, Florida-resident students typically return home, often inviting out-of-state roommates and friends to join them. This means out-of-state students rarely need to worry about booking flights home. At PBA, we firmly believe that preparedness is crucial in all situations. We take this responsibility seriously and approach it with great care.

PBAs plans in place to help prepare for the approach of a tropical storm or hurricane:

- Notification of class cancellations or campus closings prior to the storm from PBA's alert messaging system
- Information updates during the storm
- Reports on power outages or damage to campus facilities as a result of the storm
- Information on reopening campus and the resumption of classes

In the event of a tropical storm or hurricane, please note that what is shown on national news is not a firm indication of what will take place. There is no need for panic. We are grateful for the trust you have given us regarding your student's future, career, and safety. We take this trust seriously and prepare for stormy weather, making decisions with your student's safety and best interests in mind. We believe that God is our refuge and help, and we do not need to be afraid or anxious (Psalm 46:1-3).





### **Hear from a PBA Alum**



"As I look back on nearly forty years of life, it is undeniable that the most transformative season of my life was my time as a student at Palm Beach Atlantic University. Like many eighteen-year-olds, I arrived at PBA immature, prideful, self-centered, and with a very shallow, insincere faith. In addition to these shortcomings, I had no sense of direction, low self-esteem and an inability to cope with the stresses of life. During my freshman year, as a student-athlete

and pre-pharmacy major, I struggled to manage my workload. Feeling overwhelmed, I made the decision to change my major and abandon my dream of becoming a pharmacist. However, before I could act on that plan, God intervened through a PBA professor.

Today, I am blessed and privileged to have spent over 10 years at PBA's Lloyd L. Gregory School of Pharmacy as an Associate Professor and the Dean for Student Affairs.

Now, as a father of five children, with my eldest rapidly approaching college age, I am searching for a university that can provide my children with the same transformative experience that I had at Palm Beach Atlantic University. My wife and I deeply desire for our children to find a community of like-minded Jesus followers who will shape their minds, inspire their hearts, and care for their souls. We seek a university that will challenge them intellectually, develop their critical thinking and communication skills, all while keeping them rooted in the truth of God's Word. We want our children to be a part of a community where they are seen, known and loved. Our hope is not only for them to benefit from this community but also to actively participate in the work God is doing in and through the community. We desire a university that offers unique opportunities to get off the sidelines of Christianity by serving and engaging the broken world around them with the redeeming love of God. Having spent my entire adult life as part of the PBA community, I can confidently say that PBA provides all these transformative experiences and more. My wife and I would be thrilled to see each of our five children walk across the graduation stage, joining the thousands of Sailfish who have gone before them, equipped with wisdom, prepared to lead with conviction, and eager to serve God boldly."
